Pastor's Commentary

I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. ~ Isaiah 43:19

'Had a friend, a few days back, send me a link to a "new church start" that she was helping with. This was a church that was part of an older denomination - one that, a healthy majority of the existing church determined, was not taking a Jesus-centered stand on issues of justice and equality. The denomination these members are leaving was silent on important moral issues, which, as we have learned from our history with sexism and racism, is akin to complicity and acceptance of the status quo. I'm proud of them for their courage. Proud that they were strong enough to name the brokenness in their midst. Proud that they are standing up and taking action for what they believe is right.

...and it was fun to see the words they chose to summarize their renewed call to ministry, and the ministries they chose to focus on. It was the sort of presentation and call that I would feel proud to call my own.

Here are the words that I wrote to them:

Just want to congratulate your church on taking a Jesus-centered stand on matters of justice and morality. Often, it is not easy to have the courage and confidence to stand up, name the brokenness, and make choices that risk causing critique and conflict...

...but here I tip my hat and remind you that historically, you are in very good company, and I offer my prayers that your faith remains strong amidst negativity, and that you continue to hold in a clear light the call you've been given to step forward in hope.

As a UCC pastor serving the "United Protestant Church" in Morgan Park, I understand well what it feels like to share ministry and fellowship with people that do not espouse a uniform theology or morality, so while I cannot speak for the entire congregation, let me assure you that you have kinship, fellowship, and support with this pastor. Keep up the good work!

If you were to start a new church, what would you do? What would be your statement of welcome and summary? What ministries would you like to be part of? Would you do something different? Even with all of our years, these are questions we continue to ask, because the presence of God is alive and active and constantly changing and growing in each and every one of us.
