Pastor's Commentary

Fall is a feast for the senses... looking up into clear skies, framed with the bright reds and golds of the trees in transition, watching for flocks of birds in migration, and the passing clouds formed by the now cooler air...and down, to the fallen leaves that cover the path, in search for the bright mushrooms that appear out of nowhere. Around are the sounds of the season--the wind through the trees, the rustle and crunch of the leaves underfoot, the birds calling as they congregate--oh, and that overall crisp treble tone that arrives as the air grows less thick with humidity. I smile. Thank God for this gift.

Geesh, that is fun to write. Letting the words flow as the images go dancing through my head. But here's another side:

Church is a feast for the senses, looking around at the cluster of familiar faces smiling and nodding in conversation, looking down at the food that has been prepared, and shared in abundance. Listening to the steady hum of words--and I've heard, listening closer, the affirmative laughter between friends. The music rings as the choir sings and even in the silence of a time of prayer, I smile, thank God for this gift. But so too is there beauty in the sobbing of a soul that has realized it is time to change...to make a better life...to sprout (yes, even in fall) from the dark night of the soul that has kept them in fear and in mystery.

Friends, this church, and its people, are beautiful.

I urge you to dive in, with all of your senses and with all of your heart. Dive into the season of transition. Dive into the church in transition. See, things all around you are gorgeous, but you have to let yourself learn to appreciate them. Take Fall for instance: we can mumble and grumble about the coming of cold, set up our defenses, and mourn for the loss of summer days, or we can say "Oh My God (and I mean it--my God!) is this season of change a gorgeous arrangement of unnecessary beauty! But you give us, by kindness and grace, dear God, the color and scent and the feeling of Fall!"

And the church is the same: people growing and changing in faith is a gorgeous thing, but you have to let yourself learn to appreciate them. We can mumble and grumble about "how the church isn't like what it was when my parents were here" and mourn for the loss of a previous time, or we can say "My God, people's lives changing for the better, simply because we opened our doors and welcomed them! Music rolls and spirit flows and laughter abounds! Can this be church? This is not the guilt I grew up with! This is not "going through the motions"! Can I really say Amen with a smile?"

Even as we honor the souls of the faith that came before us, I'm here to tell you that something exciting is happening here. It may make you nervous--I mean, things new and different always spark apprehension--but here I ask that you take in this season of faith like this season of our land. Focus on the beauty around you. Celebrate the smiles and souls on fire. Celebrate the bright and inquisitive eyes, and the laughter of friends. It is, like the season of Fall, a gift from God. I promise you, it is healthier for your soul than frowning in fear for any cold and gray month ahead.
