## A Look Back in Time

In 1995, there was one birth, 7 baptisms, 6 deaths, 5 weddings, and 4 new members recorded. Virginia Pych was called as pastor in September.

1996: June Bothun took over historian duties. Virginia Pych was installed as pastor in February. Wednesday night Lenten services were impressive with members of the church participating. Supper was served before each service. In April, around 120 people attended a Hawaiian Luau-themed family fun night. A congregational meeting was held in June to discuss and vote on forming a Foundation Endowment Fund for the church. Committee began planning a 75th anniversary celebration to be held in September. Plates commemorating the anniversary were sold. A 75th anniversary worship service was held on September 8

followed by an outdoor picnic on the church grounds. Sunday School started with about 35 children registered. October brought some changes, with resignation of organist and council chair. A congregational meeting was called on November 24 to discuss problems that had developed in the church. The meeting ended with many questions unanswered and not much settled. The children participated in a Christmas program on December 22, followed by refreshments and a visit from Santa. There were 2 weddings, 13 funerals, and 4 new members in 1996. Carol Mortensen resigned after many years of decorating the sanctuary and taking care of plants. Even though there were difficulties, many good things happened in 1996 and it was hoped things would work out to go forward in a positive manner.
